



## Dredging ongoing at Kiwanis Pond

Work is under way to remove silt and stabilize 300 to 400 feet of shoreline at Kiwanis Pond in Janesville in an effort to create a better fishing environment. Flooding in 2008 caused shoreline erosion and transformed what was 'fairly successful fishing from the shoreline' to one where anglers are unable to cast from shore, said Tom Presny, city parks director. Silt will be dredged as much as 70 feet from the shoreline to restore what used to be water depths of 6 to 10 feet from the current 2 feet, he said. The project is estimated to cost \$15,000, Presny said, though officials didn't have an estimate on the quantity of sand that will be removed. The silt will be used along the same shoreline, where rock will be placed.
